

HEALTH REGULATIONS FOR 2006

TROY FAIR YOUTH SHOW TROY FAIR OPEN SHOW

All Cattle Must Have an Official Ear Tag
Or Breed Registration Tattoo

VACCINATION REQUIREMENT

- 1.) All animals must be accompanied by an official health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian that includes a statement that the animal(s) identified have been immunized against IBR, PI3 and BVD. Animals that have never been vaccinated against BVD or have not been vaccinated against BVD during the previous 12 months, must receive one dose of modified live virus vaccine given at least 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show or two doses of killed vaccine, two to four weeks apart, with the last dose given at least 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show. Animals that have been vaccinated against BVD within the 12 previous months, must receive at least a single injection of modified live virus or killed vaccine given not less than 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show. The date of the live virus vaccination, or the date of the last two killed virus vaccinations must be recorded on the health chart.

IMPORTANT! The date of the last virus vaccination or the dates of the last two killed virus vaccinations must be recorded on the Health Certificate.

Health tests and vaccines not required for 2006.

1. No brucellosis test is required.
2. No Tuberculosis test is required
3. No animals showing evidence of contagions, infections, or external parasitic disease shall be allowed entrance into the show.
4. **Rabies vaccinations are strongly encouraged but not required for 2006 shows.**

Other Requirements:

- A. All animals must have an official ear tag or official breed registration tattoo. **If the check-in clerk cannot read the tattoo, the exhibitor is responsible for retattooing the animal before the check-in deadline. All show animals should be held in isolation for at least 30 days after returning to the herd of origin.**
- B. No animals with any sign of ringworm will be permitted into the show. In case of questions, veterinarian approval is required.
- C. Health charts will be checked before unloading.

TROY FAIR YOUTH SHOW RULES

Important for 2006:

- Entry deadline will be STRICTLY enforced. Get them to your leader early.
- Check-in-animals MAY NOT unload until checked for signs of disease.
- MANURE REMOVAL – all exhibitors MUST transport all wet manure/bedding to a central collection point.

Entries:

1. **PLEASE PRINT** – 4-H members may enter more than 1 animal per class, but a separate entry form must be completed for each animal. Additional forms are available from your 4-H dairy leader or the extension office.
2. **Entry Deadline** – Completed paper entry forms should be given to your 4-H Dairy Leader. The 4-H Club Leader will send all entries to the extension office as a Club Unit.
3. ***** **PLEASE NOTE---** Entries may be submitted in 2006 by computer. To complete entries on-line, go to <http://go.cas.psu.edu/dairyshow/>. Click on the county drop down box, enter Bradford County and follow directions for entering. **ENTRIES FOR TROY FAIR OPEN SHOW AND 4-H DISTRICT SHOWS WILL NOT BE COMPLETE UNTIL CHECKS HAVE BEEN SENT TO THE EXTENSION OFFICE!!**

**PAPER ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED ON OR BEFORE FRIDAY, JUNE 16th, 2006, ALL COMPUTER ENTRIES TO BE COMPLETED BY JUNE 16TH.
NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED**

DISTRICT 4-H / FFA DAIRY SHOWS

1. ALL PENNSYLVANIA 4-H AND FFA EXHIBITORS CAN ATTEND THE DISTRICT SHOW OF THEIR CHOICE. EXHIBITORS MAY ATTEND 1 AND ONLY 1 DISTRICT SHOW. EACH DISTRICT SHOW WILL SET ITS OWN ENTRY FEES AND RULES.
2. A MAXIMUM OF 5 ANIMALS PER EXHIBITOR ARE ALLOWED AT DISTRICT SHOWS. HOWEVER, ONLY 3 ANIMALS ARE ALLOWED AT THE STATE JUNIOR DAIRY SHOW.

PENNSYLVANIA STATE 4-H / FFA YOUTH SHOW / DRESS CODE

Clothes and person should be neat and clean. **A plain all-white uniform is required.** Knee length or longer skirts for females are acceptable. **Non-show hats, shorts, blue jeans, bare feet, sleeveless shirts, and sandals will not be allowed.** Any exhibitors not meeting these standards will not be allowed to participate in the show. A harness with the entry number displayed, both front and back, will be considered as part of the uniform and must be worn while in the show ring. For those who do not have access to a harness, they may pin the numbers on their front and back. Uniforms bearing farm names or advertising will not be acceptable in the show ring.

*** Following the Pennsylvania State 4-H/FFA dress code at the Troy Fair Youth Show is encouraged. Non-show hats, shorts, blue jeans, bare feet, sleeveless shirts, and sandals will not be allowed. Black or green show pants are acceptable.

8. Dry cow, Senior 2 years and over born before March 1, 2004

17. **DAUGHTER – DAM CLASS:** Any age, both owned by 1 exhibitor, 1 entry per exhibitor.
18. **BEST 3 FEMALES:** 3 animals any age, all owned by 1 exhibitor.
19. **PRODUCE OF DAM:** 2 animals any age, the produce of 1 cow, both owned by 1 exhibitor, 1 entry per exhibitor.
20. **CLUB / CHAPTER HERD:** 4 registered animals from 1 club or chapter, any breed.
21. **BEST BRED & OWNED FEMALE:** Selected from all blue ribbon animals bred & owned by exhibitor. There will be divisions for junior and senior animals.

SUBSTITUTIONS: If for some reason, an animal you enter is not able to show, substitutions may be made. You may substitute “junior” animals, under 2 years of age, for junior animals and “senior” animals, 2 years or older, for senior animals.

ROUND-UP CHAPERONES: Each club must have at least 1 adult chaperone staying with 4-H members in the barns the night before Round up. **RADIOS WILL BE TURNED OFF BY 11:00 P.M.** Quiet time will be enforced after 11:00 p.m.

***** PLEASE NOTE: ONLY 4-H AND FFA DAIRY EXHIBITORS WHO ARE TAKING CARE OF CATTLE WILL BE ALLOWED TO STAY OVERNIGHT IN THE DAIRY BARN. ALL OTHER YOUTH MUST BE OUT OF THE BARN AREA BY 11:00 PM**

MANURE REMOVAL POLICY: Exhibitors are responsible for the removal of all wet manure/bedding from the barns to a central location point. We suggest you bring a wheelbarrow to share with other club members. Stalls are to contain dry bedding only when you leave the barn.

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT: There is no other event in our area that draws a larger number of people with little or no agricultural background than the Troy Fair. This is a great opportunity for 4-H

and FFA members to show agriculture in a positive light and to educate the public on the very positive aspects of agriculture and the dairy industry.

Exhibitors should be willing to explain daily tasks and to answer questions from people viewing their animals. If you are asked a question you are not sure how to answer, find the nearest leader, extension agent, or parent and have them help you explain. Showing dairy cattle is a learning experience for the 4-H member as well as the people visiting the fair.

RULES OF OWNERSHIP:

I. Bred and Owned by Exhibitor

Animals bred and owned by the exhibitor must *be registered in the exhibitor's name by the Show date.*

II. Animals Not Bred by Exhibitor

A. Date of Ownership

1. Animals showing in the fall yearling or younger classes must be ***owned by the exhibitor on or before May 1, 2006.***
2. Animals showing in the junior 2 year old or older classes must be ***owned by the exhibitor on or before January 1, 2006.***
3. The date of sale shown on the registration certificate will be considered as the date of ownership in all cases.

B. Partnership Ownership

1. Partnership ownership will only be accepted if the exhibitor's name appears on the registration, and is in partnership with a 4-H club or FFA Chapter.
2. Partnership animals must be owned by the acceptable partnership, in accordance with the dates listed in Section A1 and A2, above.

III. Project Animal Registration Requirements

A. Registration Requirements. All animals must have registration certificates issued by one of the following breed associations: American Guernsey Assoc., American Jersey Cattle Club, American Milking Shorthorn Society, Ayrshire Breeders Assoc., Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders Assoc., Holstein Assoc. of America, or Red and White Dairy Cattle Assoc.

1. **Jerseys:** Animals with Genetic Recovery (fully registered) certificates are eligible. **This does not include Original Animals (OA) or Provisional Registry (PR) animals.**
2. **Guerneys:** Females in Step 4 of the Genetic Recovery program are eligible. Step 4 females have a "PR" prefix in their name. No other prefixes are eligible.
3. **Holsteins:** Any animal identified with Holstein Assoc., USA Inc. that is 87% or higher Registered Holstein Ancestry (RHA) is eligible. Previous animals identified as Qualified Entry (QE) animals are eligible. Eligible animals will have a Qualified Holstein certificate with a red border. Only QE animals with a red-

border certificate (4th generation) are eligible. **Green certificates or IHF certificates are not eligible.**

4. **Red & White Dairy Cattle Association:** These animals must be true red in hair color and have a registration certificate from the Red & White Dairy Cattle Assoc. (phone (814) 735-4221). Registration certificates from other breeds will not be accepted for the Red & White classes.
5. **Brown Swiss:** Step II IE Identify Enrollment animals that have a 379 plus six digit registration number are eligible to the shown. The registration certificate is green with a black border.
6. **Milking Shorthorns:** Cattle must have full herd book 6 digit Milking Shorthorn Registry Certificates. Tattoo numbers must correspond with registry certificates. Milking Shorthorn females with 9 digit Birth Record certificates (beginning with 36,000 or 37,000) are not eligible to show.
7. **Canadian registry certificates will not be accepted.**
8. **Animals must show in the same breed show at the Troy Fair Youth Dairy Show, qualifying district show and at the PA Junior Dairy Show. An animal may only show in 1 breed show at the Troy Fair Youth Dairy Show, district shows and at the PA Junior Dairy Show.**

B. Grade Animals

1. Grade animals are accepted at the Troy Fair Youth Show / 4-H Roundup only.
2. Grade animals cannot qualify for district 4-H / FFA competition.

C. Leased Animals

Leased animals may be exhibited at the Troy Youth Show, District 4-H / FFA Shows and the PA Junior Dairy Show. Existence of the lease with a project plan must be recorded by May 1, 2006. Leased animals must be housed in Pennsylvania. Cows may be leased by the exhibitor only if they were previously leased as calves or yearlings. Parents and guardians are not permitted to lease animals to their children. An exhibitor who owns animals may not lease other animals. Partnership animals are only allowed if the partnership is with a 4-H club or FFA Chapter.

Troy Fair Youth Dairy Show

Tuesday, July 25, 2006 – 9:30 A.M.

(Refer to General Rules)

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. **Eligibility**—The Troy Fair Youth Dairy Show is open to all youth residing in Bradford County who are of 4-H eligible age (must be 8 years of age by January 1, 2006 and must not have reached 19 years of age before January 1, 2006). In addition, all youth are eligible to exhibit who are enrolled in a dairy project under the supervision of a Vocational Agriculture Teacher or County Extension Agent in Bradford County, and is within the state age limits for FFA and/or 4-H programs.
 2. **SHOW ENTRIES MUST BE RECEIVED OR POSTMARKED BY FRIDAY, JUNE 16th AT THE BRADFORD COUNTY EXTENSION OFFICE.** Entry blanks are available from the County Extension Office, 4-H Leaders or Vo-Agriculture Supervisors. Send complete entries to Bradford County Extension, 701 South 4th St., Towanda Pa. 18848.
 3. **Ownership**---Animals bred and owned by the exhibitor must be registered in the exhibitor's name by the show date. Animals not bred by the exhibitor that are less than two years of age must be owned by the exhibitor by **May 1, 2006**. Animals two years of age and older must be owned by the exhibitor on or before **January 1, 2006**. The date of sale shown on the registration certificate will be considered as the date of ownership.
 4. **Arrival Time**—the stalls will be ready to receive animals at 1:00 PM on Sunday, July 23rd. All animals must arrive and be checked in by 6:00 P.M. Monday; July 24th. Youth entering the "Clipping and Fitting Contest" must have animals checked in prior to the beginning of the contest on Monday, July 24th..
 5. **Checkout Time** — all youth animals must stay until one-half hour after completion of the show on Tuesday July 25th or at the discretion of the show superintendent. All animals not entered in the open show must leave after the show except for the Youth Show Breed Grand Champions. All bedding needs to go to the manure pit when you leave.
 6. **Animals staying for the Open Show** —any animal staying for the Open Show will need to abide by the rules for the Open Show.
- **All youth show participants are eligible to show in the Troy Fair Open shows provided they have proper registration papers for the breed being shown.**
7. **Cattle Housing** — All 4-H and FFA animals must be housed in the barn provided for them. These animals must be tied in their assigned stalls.
 8. **Contagious Diseases**— all animals will be visually checked for contagious diseases before they are unloaded from the truck. The health and registration papers will be checked by the check-in committee.
 9. **Showing**—all exhibitors are responsible for getting their animals to the ring on time. If for some reason an exhibitor should become sick or for other reasons cannot show his/her animal, he or she may allow another 4-H or FFA member the same age or younger to show for them.
 10. **Bedding and Hay**—all bedding, hay and other feed is to be furnished by the exhibitor.
 11. Exhibitors are responsible for the removal of manure and bedding from the barns to a central collection point. Wheelbarrows are suggested - bring your own or share.
 12. Any person causing a disturbance during the day or night, will be excluded from the grounds with their animals, and will not be allowed to show.
 13. All exhibitors who are caring for 4-H Dairy Projects must stay in the area of the cattle barns after 11:00 p.m. All others will be asked to leave the cattle barn area at 11:00 P.M.

14. All youth entries that wish to show in the open show must be pre-entered in the open show, except for the Youth Show Breed Grand Champions.
15. In the absence of animals in the milking classes within a breed, the judge will only select a junior champion.
16. There is no parking in front of the barns and the lower entrance is for exit only.
17. Only 4-H and FFA Dairy Exhibitors will be allowed to stay overnight in the dairy barns. All other youth must be out of the barn area by 11:00 PM.

All youth entered must choose a calf or yearling for this contest. No milking animals will be acceptable. The entrant must make arrangements to have clippers, extension cord, brushes, etc. available for their use during the contest. Each animal must arrive at the show unclipped except for the head. The head may be clipped beforehand. No adults are allowed to assist in any way. Another member is permitted to hold the animal during clipping. The animal being clipped may or may not be your project animal. However, a health chart is required to bring additional animals onto the fairgrounds. If an animal is brought in specifically for the clipping contest, it can be brought in and taken home the day of the contest.

The judge of the clipping and fitting contest will primarily judge the clipping of the animal, but the judge will also take into account cleanliness, grooming, and body condition of the animal being entered.

3. Junior Division ---- Ages 9, 10, and 11

The annual 4-H Livestock and Milk Auction Sale will take place Wednesday, July 26th, 2006 beginning at approximately 10:00 a.m. The sale order for 2006 will be as follows:

A special milk jug along with other gifts will be sold to recognize the Troy Fair Youth Show Supreme Champion as well as the Grand and Reserve Champions from all dairy breeds during the milk auction portion of the sale.

The proceeds from the sale are divided between the 4-H and/or FFA members who own the champions, the club or chapter in which they are a member, and the Bradford County Dairy Promotion Program. In addition, a portion of the proceeds from the milk auction each year help in supporting the Bradford county 4-H Scholarship Fund.

4-H and/or FFA members who own the champion cows must be present and in appropriate dress during the milk auction. **SHOW CLOTHES ARE PREFERRED!**

EVALUATION OF 4-H DAIRY, LIVESTOCK & GOAT PROJECTS

Please note all Dairy, Livestock, and Goat Projects will be judged on Saturday, July 22nd. The criteria for judging these projects are found in the back of the animal project record book (green "project evaluation" form).

As you will note from this form, criteria for judging the 4-H project includes the following:

- Leader Project Evaluation (Back of Record Book) - 10 points
- Project Activities (7 activities should be completed per year) – 25 points
- 4-H Activity Report (Back of Record Book) – 10 points
- Project Records – 35 points
- Story - 20

TOTAL----- 100 POINTS

Project books and record forms must be turned in on or before Saturday, July 22, 2:00 pm in order to complete this year's 4-H project.

**** In addition**, all 4-H members must include a story for each project they have enrolled in. This story should include information on experiences with the 4-H animal project, what was learned from completing the records form, experiences gained from being involved in the member's 4-H club, and experiences with county judging and/or bowl activities. As a guideline, 4-H members should write a minimum of 1 sentence for each year of age.
